
Martha's Vineyard Mediation Program JUNE 2020 ANNUAL REPORT

ince 1984 Martha's Vineyard Mediation Program has provided conflict resolution services and thousands of community members have benefitted. These services help to create a more peaceful Island. Our goal is to make our motto a reality: We can work it out!

Rebuilding over the last decade since the previous financial downturn, our program has made significant differences in the lives of many Island residents. In 2019 and 2020 we supported hundreds directly - and many more who are linked with these families, workplaces, neighbors, non-profits, businesses, and consumers. CONFLICT COACHING SERVICES

Since our implementation of Conflict Coaching in 2019 we have helped over 50 people and have provided training for 16 coaches, many of whom use the skills in their workplace duties. In conflict coaching, a coach works 1-to-1 with a client to develop new conflict resolution skills. Conflict coaching clients leave with a realistic plan they develop with the help of their coach.



NEUTRAL FACILITATION

When an organization needs to conduct a difficult conversation, our neutral facilitation can help to cut through the hardened attitudes and emotions. Businesses, extended families, organizations and municipalities have made use of our facilitation services. Ongoing contracts include team projects and topics that benefit from our neutrality and pragmatic down to earth methods. We work collaboratively, responding to each unique opportunity for us to help with communication and team building. As an additional service we have two qualified Restorative Justice facilitators available.

FISCAL YEAR 2020 BUDGET \$114,000

n FY 2020 we provided services in over 130 cases involving close to 300 individuals and families. From high value cases derived from Superior Court to individual consultations, our program is able to do more with less.

We offered six courses totaling 120 hours of class time in mediation, conflict coaching, youth mediation, workplace conflict and public service conflict resolution. We provided workshops for the public. Dozens of people have acquired skills to help resolve conflicts in their lives, workplaces and families.

We completed a number of organizational facilitation projects, helping family farms, non-profits, public service offices and businesses to develop conflict management plans.

OUR GOALS 2017 - 2019

EXPAND COMMUNITY CASES

From a low of 12 community cases in 2017 to well over 100 today we have expanded our community case services to serve more community members.

PUBLIC PROGRAMS

Our public programs included the topic of landlord/tenants, estate planning, restorative justice, communication education in the local jail. Expanding our reach more widely has moved MVMP beyond the courtroom and the conference room.

INTRODUCTION TO MEDIATION COURSE

We now hold an Introduction to Mediation Course once or twice a year with new mediators participating in an intensive apprenticeship.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Mediation is a set of complicated skills. MVMP provides ongoing skill building and professional coursework to set a high bar for our work.

OUR GOALS 2019 - 2020

YOUTH MEDIATION

We successfully built the Youth Mediators program, a dedicated group of qualified youth who can mediate conflicts among young people. The youth program has created an oral history video exhibit of elders and youth calling forth the Wampanoag legacy of conflict resolution.

CONFLICT COACHING

We have created a Conflict Coaching program, with our own model called CLAMSHELL, for clients to work 1-to-1 with a conflict coach in order to improve their approach to handling life conflicts and leave with a plan.

WORKPLACE CONFLICT

We have worked with almost 100 individuals who want to gain skills and tools to successfully manage conflict in the workplace.
