### AN ISLAND...


N THE MIDST OF A WORLD full of violence, incivility, and dehumanization we seek to create an island of calm and peaceful optimism.

#### ...OF CAPABLE, COMPETENT...






### **2022 CASES**

THE NUMBER OF CASES we have supported has increased dramatically thanks to the hard work of our dedicated volunteers and staff. The diversity of these cases matches the diversity of our communities.

During the twelve months of 2022, we handled 296 cases, and mediated 167, with a total of 142 agreements, achieved through 246 mediation sessions. In 85% of cases there were final agreements developed by parties through a self-determination.


Most of our services were offered for free to the participants in mediation, thanks to the generosity of our funders and individual donors and through the donation of volunteer services.
